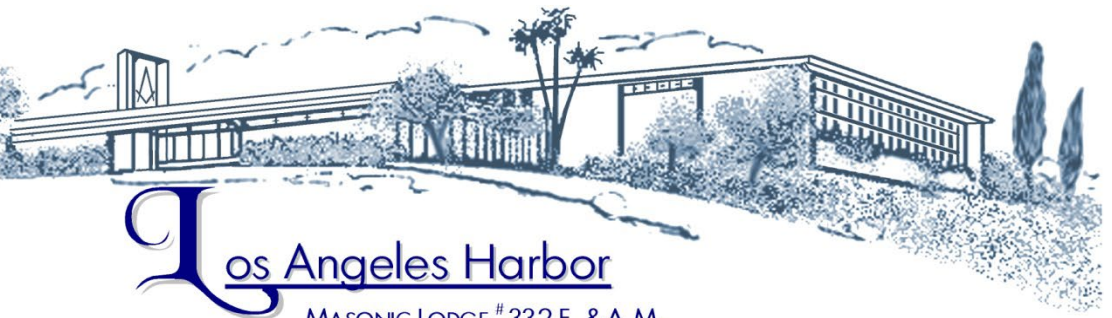

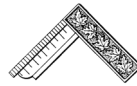

THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

The signing of the *Declaration of Independence* on 4 July 1776 was not merely a political act, but a philosophical declaration steeped in Enlightenment ideals and Masonic principles.

Moreover, Freemasonry's commitment to tolerance and inclusivity has helped shape a diverse and inclusive American society. From its earliest days, Freemasonry welcomed men of different backgrounds and beliefs, fostering a sense of unity and mutual respect among its members. This diversity continues to resonate within the fraternity and serves as a model for building harmonious communities based on shared values and common purpose.

The fraternity's contributions to the *Declaration of Independence*, *Constitution*, and broader societal fabric highlight its profound impact on American history and governance.

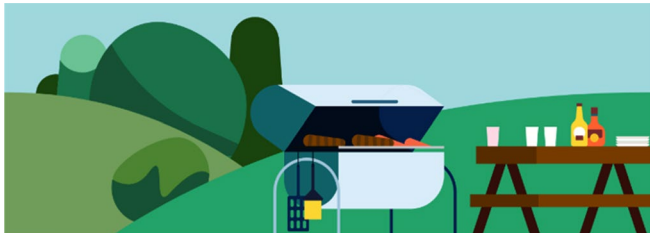

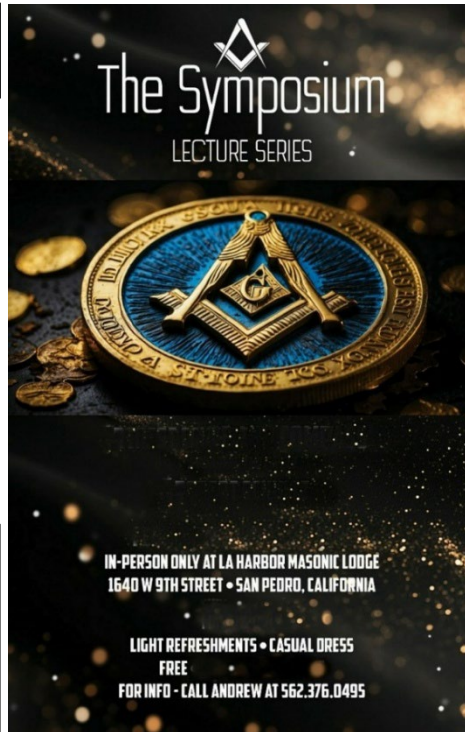
