



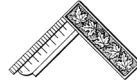

**THE CABLE TOW**

The *Cable-tow* is a Masonic term with varied meanings and historical interpretations. In exploring the significance and symbolism of the term "cable-tow" in Freemasonry, we find that its use emphasizes its moral implications. It symbolizes a pledge or vow, often linked to life and obligation. In English lodges, it is used in the first degree; in American lodges, it appears in all three degrees.

The term has roots in Hebrew and Dutch, both meaning "rope." Similar concepts existed in ancient cultures, including India and Egypt, where cords symbolized pledges.

The cable-tow is the outward and visible symbol of a vow and represents the bond between the initiate and the fraternity. It signifies a transition from physical restraint to moral obligation during initiation. The removal of the cable-tow symbolizes the shift from outer authority to inner commitment.

A cable-tow has two ends and binds Masons to each other and the fraternity to its members. It emphasizes the fraternity's duty to guide and train its members. The concept of control in Masonry is about moral influence rather than force.

The length of the cable-tow is symbolically defined, varying from 720 feet to three miles. However, for each Mason it determines the reach of his moral principles based on personal circumstances and actions...and of that distance each must be his own judge, passing judgement upon himself accordingly, by his own acts in aid of others.


**Los Angeles Harbor Lodge #332 Annual Family Holiday Party      Wednesday Dec 10, 2025**
