From the South

Greetings from the South,

As we move through the "winter " and into spring I thought these next two months would be an ideal opportunity to share with you some information about my hometown in England. But before I begin with that I will touch base on the upcoming events at the Lodge. We will be having two Mariner's Nights in March, the first is on the Friday 6th followed by one on Friday 20th, this second event is nearest to St Patrick's Day so we hope to be serving the traditional American fayre of Corned Beef and Cabbage, I say "traditional American fayre" because my wife is from Belfast and her family have never had corned beef and cabbage in their life – Sorry. As we move into April the first weekend is Easter Weekend, which allows me to seg-way perfectly to share information on Whitby, my hometown (marked on the map in the NE of England). The synod of Whitby took place in 664AD, King Oswiu of Northumbria ruled that his kingdom would calculate the date for Easter and observe the monastic tonsure according to the customs of Rome, rather than the customs practiced by Iona and its satellite institutions (the Celtic customs). The photo, below right, shows the Abbey ruins (top right) perched on the cliff top overlooking the harbor. The photo also show a beach made famous in Dracula. In the Bram Stoker novel, which was written and partly set in Whitby, Dracula wrecks a boat on the beach and disguised as a black dog leaps from the boat and runs up the 199 steps to the church graveyard next the Abbey.



The first Mariner's night in April is on 3rd which is Good Friday, the next is on April 20th. At this point I would like to thank everyone who has volunteered to do the catering for these Mariner's nights, especially our band of Janglers who have really stepped up – thanks guys.
