# For REFLECTION



## *First "Official" Presidential Proclamation by: Brother George Washington*

Whereas it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor; and Whereas both Houses of Congress have, by their joint committee, requested me to *"recommend to the people of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness:"*

Now, therefore, I do recommend and assign Thursday, the 26th day of November next, to be devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the beneficent author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be; that we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks for His kind care and protection of the people of this country previous to their becoming a nation; for the signal and manifold mercies and the favorable interpositions of His providence in the course and conclusion of the late war; for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty which we have since enjoyed; for the peaceable and rational manner in which we have been enable to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national one now lately instituted for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed, and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and, in general, for all the great and various favors which He has been pleased to confer upon us.

And also that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech Him to pardon our national and other transgressions; to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually; to render our National Government a blessing to all the people by constantly being a Government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed; to protect and guide all sovereigns and nations (especially such as have shown kindness to us), and to bless them with good governments, peace, and concord; to promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, and the increase of science among them and us; and, generally to grant unto all mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as He alone knows to be best.

Given under my hand, at the city of New York, the 3d day of October, A.D. 1789.

## From the South

As we approach the depths of winter here in SoCal I wish you warmest greetings from the South.

The holiday season is upon us and with it the many traditions, many of which are generic and also many, I am sure, are unique to your family and its heritage. However you celebrate it is also a time to reflect and think about those who may not be fortunate enough to enjoy a feast surrounded by friends and family.

This year I have shared some of the traditions and history from my hometown in England. A large tradition at this time of year in England is the celebration of the failure of the Gunpowder Plot in 1605. This was an assassination attempt on King James 1 and the Parliament by a group of Catholics who wished to return England to a Catholic state. The plot was thwarted and Guy Fawkes was found under Parliament with 36 barrels of gunpowder. Guy Fawkes, along with other conspirators were arrested and killed. The failure of this plot is celebrated with bonfires, on top of which an effigy of Guy Fawkes is burnt. As kids we would go round the neighbourhood with the effigy in a wheelbarrow asking for "a penny for the Guy", this would be used to buy fireworks which are traditionally let off on this night. During November, at the lodge, we continue with our Mariners Nights on the 1st and 3rd Fridays (6th and 20th November). December also sees us hosting Mariners Nights on the 4th and 18th.

Our big social event in December is the traditional Christmas Party, come on out for great food, the ever popular Jim Gamble Puppet Show and if we are lucky and well behaved I think we can expect a visit from the big guy in the red suit!!!!!!

As my stint as Junior Warden winds down I would like to express my thanks to all the brethren who have ensured the lodge members have been fed and watered this year.
