# Isaiah Plick Interview with Dick Watson

# 1. What made you join masonry?

My Grandfather and father was a mason, and my Masonic heritage played an important part in my decision to join masonry.

- 2. When did you decide that you wanted to become an officer of the Lodge? In 1986. That was the first year that I started going through the Line.
- 3. When was your first year as Worshipful Master? In 1993.
- 4. Tell me about that experience.

I had a great time. It was definitely a unique experience. The Master is the guy who determines the direction of the Lodge during his term. 5. What was your biggest accomplishment during your first term?

During my First term the Stone Sign was decided upon and built in

order to bring more visibility to the lodge. In addition, During my term we had 11 initiations and held degrees every Wednesday. Most months we tried to hold a First, Second, and Third Degree.

6. How many guys regularly attended Lodge during your term?

There were 30-35 guys who regularly attended meeting and Degree Ceremonies in 1993. In 1976 when I first was initiated there were 60 guys every meeting.

7. What made you decide to go through the Line again?

In 1994 the guy who was supposed to become Junior Warden had moved and I was the only one available to take his spot.


8. What was your biggest accomplishment during your term in 1996? In 1996 we were able to hold many Saturday Work Parties which al-

Over the weekend of March 22-24, I attended the Masters and Wardens Retreat in Newport Beach and found it to be an amazing experience. There were major revisions in the Retreat this year when compared to prior years. Besides the many new friends I made with the brothers who attended, I learned a lot about Masonry and our charitable works from the 2013 Grand Master, the Grand Masters for 2014 and 2015, the Grand Secretary and many other excellent presenters.

Grand Lodge has developed online training for new Entered Apprentices, Fellow Crafts, and Master Masons, to ensure that they are getting the Masonic education needed for their advancement. I attended breakout sessions about online education, candidate coaching, and the character investigation candidate investigation process. There were other breakout sessions on budgeting and investing but there was only time to attend three.

We also learned about a tool they have developed called "Solomon's Wheel" that aids us in using the three main tenets of Masonry, Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth, along with the four cardinal virtues of Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence, and Justice, to solve problems at our Lodges and throughout our lives in ways that are consistent with our Values. When the materials are made available electronically, I plan to make a presentation at one of our stated meetings so that we all can benefit from what I learned.

Finally, we had a presentation about the Masonic Homes and our various related programs that illustrated how we fulfill our sacred obligation to aid and assist our brother Masons and their families. I left with a renew love of our Fraternity and pride in what we stand for and what we have accomplished. It really is great to be a Mason!
