Excerpts from Manly P. Hall, Secret Teachings of All Ages

THE QUALIFICATIONS OF A TRUE MASON

All true Masons know that their work is not secret, but they realize that it must remain unknown to all who do not live the true Masonic life. Yet if the socalled secrets of Freemasonry were shouted from the housetops, the Fraternity would be absolutely safe; for certain spiritual qualities are necessary before the real Masonic secrets can be understood by the brethren themselves. Hence it is that the alleged "exposures" of Freemasonry, printed by the thousands and tens of thousands since 1730 down to the present hour, cannot injure the Fraternity. They reveal merely the outward forms and ceremonies of Freemasonry. Only those who have been weighed in the balance and found to be true, upright, and square have prepared themselves by their own growth to appreciate the inner meanings of their Craft. To the rest of their brethren within or without the lodge their sacred rituals must remain, as Shakespeare might have said, "Words, words," Within the Mason's own being is concealed the Power, which, blazi ng forth from his purified being, constitutes the Builder's Word. His life is the sole password which admits him to the true Masonic Lodge. His spiritual urge is the sprig of acacia which, through the darkness of ignorance, still proves that the spiritual fire is alight. Within himself he must build those qualities which will make possible his true understanding of the Craft. He can show the world only forms which mean nothing; the life within is fo rever concealed until the eye of Spirit reveals it.

The Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man were united in the completion of the Eternal Temple, the Great Work, for which all things came into being and through which all shall glorify their Creator.

MASONS, AWAKE!

Your creed and your Craft demand the best that is in you. They demand the sanctifying of your life, the regeneration of your body, the purification of your soul, and the ordination of your spirit. Yours is the glorious opportunity; yours is the divine responsibility. Accept your task and follow in the footsteps of the Master Masons of the past, who with the flaming spirit of the Craft have illumined the world. From the South

Brethren:

At the Masters and Wardens Retreat that I attended in May, we learned of a new tool created by Grand Lodge to help us solve problems, not just problems in our Lodges, but problems we might encounter at work, in our personal lives, or anywhere else. This tool is called Solomon's Wheel and incorporates the Four Cardinal Virtues of Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence, and Justice and the three Main Tenets of Masonry: Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth.

The Four Cardinal Virtues and Three Main Tenets of Masonry, which are placed within a circle that is divided into eight sections, were taught to us in our rituals not only to use in the Lodge but throughout our lives to help us become better men and better leaders. There is also a blank spot on the wheel which I have filled with Mercy, but you can fill that section with anything that might help you deal with a particular problem or proposition. As you deal with a situation, look at the wheel, and think about which sections (if not all of them) may help you solve the problem, how that may translate into action. If you do nothing, the problem certainly will not solve itself.

For example, assume that you have dissension in your Lodge. Two brothers have disagreements that cause hard feelings and lack of cooperation. What parts of Solomon's Wheel might help you resolve that issue? Brotherly Love is one that immediately jumps out at me. Remind the brothers that Brotherly Love is not an optional virtue in Masonry. Find brothers who are not emotionally invested in the opposing positions but who have good relationships with each brother and have them help figure out a compromise or resolution. It may be easier for them to speak frankly with each brother, as mediators. We must also remember that Truth is crucial in most situations; without honesty, how do we even know when we have a solution? Think about each and every section and try to figure how that might help deal with the situation.

As you approach Solomon's Wheel, go back and read the lectures on the Four Cardinal Virtues and Three Main Tenets of Masonry. Review the Candidates' Guides. Remember why you became a Mason and use these important tools throughout your life. Solomon's Wheel already has helped me deal with issues in several areas of life. Let it help you, too. I will be happy to discuss Solomon's Wheel and try to answer any questions you have.
