## Greetings from the West

We have witnessed over the last few years a very disturbing decline in membership and support, and interest in Freemasonry in general. I have seen too many brethren in the past few years from our lodge walk away because we aren't offering community service or something new and different from the routine. This needs to change.

This lack of different events and lack of supporting our current events is the cause of most of the issues we are facing today. Our lodge's membership attendance at our events is dwindling because we aren't providing the support that is needed to make these events more successful. Brethren, without us supporting ourselves, how can we expect the community to support us and continue to thrive as a lodge?

I truly think we need to change the way we operate and run the lodge with fresh ideas and new means of income. It is not my intention to sound negative, but we do need to get serious about our future. We need to remember we are all On The Level and to Best Work and Best Agree if we wish to have Los Angeles Harbor Lodge around for future generations.

Thank You Brethren, and I hope this motivates you to come back to lodge more often and help us grow together, or at least gives you something to think about. Till next time, Brothers.
