



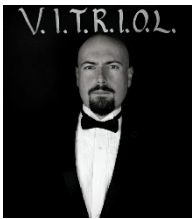

I first want to congratulate and thank Worshipful Paul Galyean for a great 2018 by keeping the lodge on top of its responsibilities and by being the leader we needed.

- 2) More Community Engagement - We need to engage with the Chamber of Commerce, local schools, and community organizations. This is a must for our lodge's survival and something we been lacking for some time now. We are going to stay active in local community events throughout the year and will be hosting local school, interest group and clientele needs at our property. I want to thank Brothers Donald Joe and Oscar Garcia for volunteering to spearhead this endeavor to better our relations with the local communities and get us back on the map as a major venue. I am confident that their past professional track records with multiple non-profits will produce the results we need.
- 3) Take a Sense of Ownership and Responsibility for OUR HOME - the above will be in vain if we don't. Everyone is told when you join this fraternity that "you get out of Freemasonry what you put into it" and this statement couldn't be more true in these times. If we leave the burden on a few people to make things happens, then our events and lodge will surely fail. This is something we cannot afford to do any longer as we are only hurting ourselves in the long term.

We all need to put forth our integrity, expertise and ingenuity these coming years if we are to make a lasting and positive impact on our communities and ourselves. This organization allows itself to be whatever our hearts choose it to be, a fraternity, a spiritual practice, a social experience, etc. I hope we can all find common ground and start building up something truly great. I am very optimistic for our future here at Los Angeles Harbor Lodge #332 and am looking forward to a very productive and enhancing coming year, as you should also.
